

ORDINANCE NO. 04-2014-675

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF GRANT COUNTY PERTAINING TO THE COUNTY MAINTENANCE OF STEVENS CREEK Road

WHEREAS, the Grant County Fiscal Court has heretofore adopted a comprehensive ordinance relating to the codification of all ordinances in force within the jurisdiction of Grant County, Kentucky;

WHEREAS, the Grant County Fiscal Court is desirous of changing three portions of said ordinance, specifically those subsections labeled "Roadway," "Beginning Point," and "Length (in feet)" as same pertains to STEVENS CREEK Road in Section 94.32; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GRANT COUNTY FISCAL COURT THAT:

1. That subsections labeled "Roadway," "Beginning Point," and "Length (in feet)" as same pertains to Stevens Creek Road in Section 94.32 of the Code of Grant County which now does not include any mention of Stevens Creek is amended so that same shall now read in full "Stevens Creek," "Golds Valley Road," and "4080 Feet".


2. All ordinances in conflict with this ordinance, or portions thereof, shall be deemed repealed from and after the effective date of this ordinance, to the extent of such conflict.






